Prescriptive authority for psychologists promises that high quality mental health care can be accessed by all populations: rich and poor, urban and rural, men and women of all sexual orientations, European Americans, Native American, African American, Hispanic American, Asian American. Prescriptive authority for psychologists promises that psychotherapy will be well integrated with pharmacotherapy; that the 15-minute “med check” is, generally, substandard care; that patients’ needs will come before financial considerations; that a full continuum of high quality care can be provided by psychologists; that peer-reviewed research will inform practice; and that the pharmaceutical companies’ efficacy literature will have minimal influence on the psychologist-prescriber.



The passage of Prescriptive Authority legislation is of paramount importance to psychologists with advanced training in Clinical Psychopharmacology.

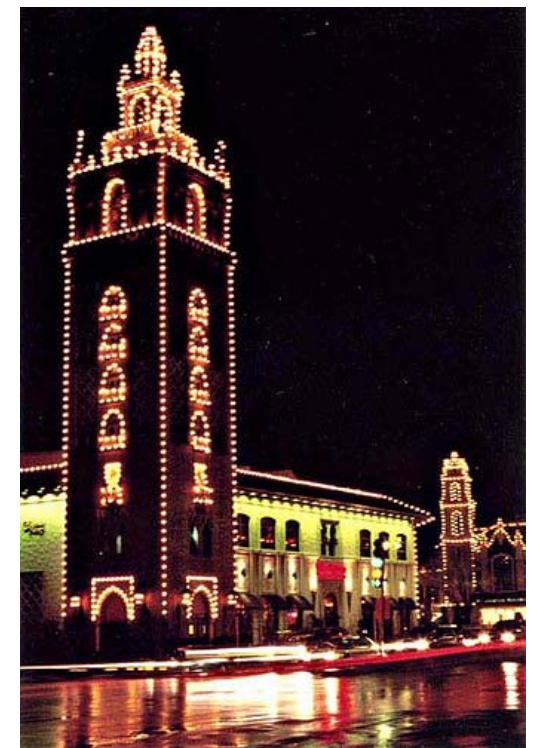
